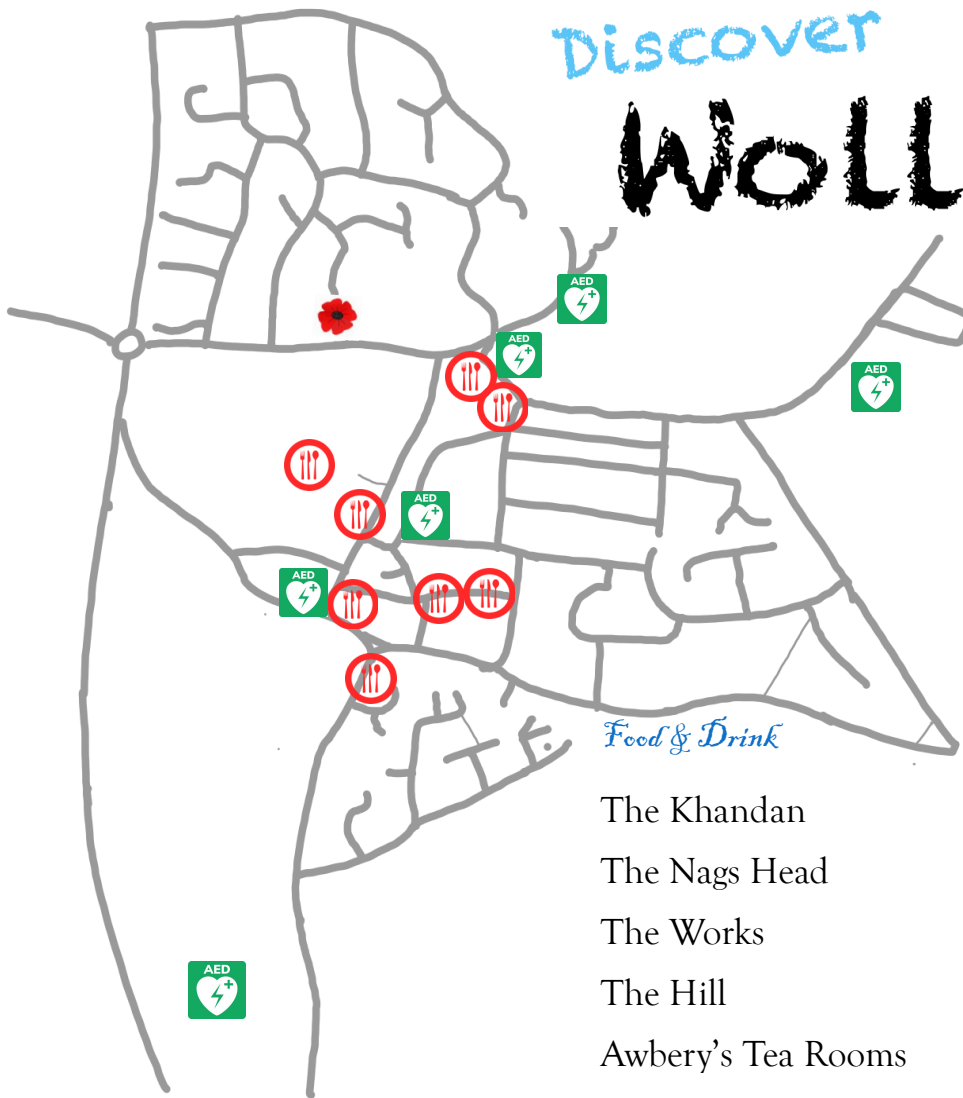

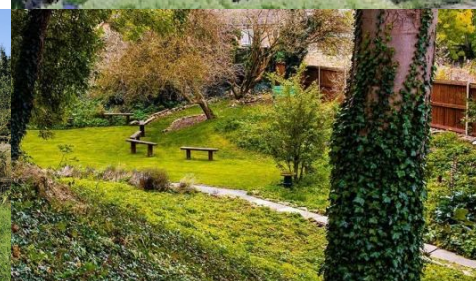

A DAY AT THE PALACE

Every year, Northants CALC has the pleasure of nominating one councillor and their guest to go to the Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace. The award recognises long and meritorious service, and this year the honour went to Cllr John Mitchell from Wollaston Parish Council. Here, John describes his wonderful day out...

"It was an honour and privilege to have been nominated and invited to attend the recent Buckingham Palace Garden Party representing Northamptonshire Town and Parish Councils.

My wife and I arrived at 2.15pm at the top of Constitution Hill to join the queue waiting to enter the Palace at Hyde Park Gate. The queue was about 100 meters long at that stage and lengthened to almost 300 m by the time the gates opened just before the scheduled 3pm. Security was tight, requiring guests to show two items of identity. We meandered our way through the gardens, passing the lake, towards the main lawn. The lawn and gardens are so extensive that the 8,000 guests easily mingled, although seating within the garden and by the tea tents was limited so that it was standing room only for much of the afternoon. Tea was served soon after 3.30pm and we joined the crowd in the 200m long tea tent and were soon served with finger sandwiches, scones and cakes, all the delicacies of a Royal event. Having finished our tea we found that people had been gathering and were 5/6 deep around the cordoned off area awaiting the arrival of the Royal Family. The Yeoman of the Guard made their entry from the Palace followed by the King and Queen, Princess Anne, Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh and Duke and Duchess of Gloucester. The National Anthem was then played. The Royal Party moved through the cordoned off area speaking to selected guests introduced by the Gentlemen at Arms. The event was an example of precision organisation and amazing to be among the many guests socialising and enjoying the Palace gardens.

It was chilly in the late afternoon but the warmth of the occasion and being guests of King Charles in his "back yard", ensured a memorable day."

Now that we have entered the Autumn Term, we wanted to share with you a topic which is often overlooked in settings and the home!

The Power of Storytime

In a world of fast-paced technology, constant stimulation, and jam-packed schedules, there is something remarkably simple, and profoundly powerful about storytime. Whether it's a parent or carer curling up together at bedtime to read a story or a pre-school teacher gathering curious minds on a reading rug; Storytime remains one of the most influential tools in childhood development.

But what makes storytime so powerful?

It's not just about reading words on a page. It's about connection, growth and imagination.

1. Reading aloud is a workout for the brain. From infancy, children absorb rhythm, tone and patterns of language. Storytime exposes young minds to vocabulary beyond everyday discussion; this early exposure to rich language supports sentence structure, phonemic recognition, listening and comprehension and vocabulary growth.
2. Storytime fosters imagination and creativity. Every story is a portal to another world, whether it's a jungle full of animals or a rocket zooming to the moon. This fuels creativity, helps with abstract thinking and supports emotional processing.
3. Storytime helps create emotional and social bonds. Reading a story aloud strengthens the bonds between caregivers and children. Neuroscience has shown that warm interactive reading releases oxytocin, often called the 'feel good hormone'. The emotional safety also allows children to explore difficult topics, ask questions and confront fears and feel seen all within the safety of a story.
4. Stories are powerful vessels for values, from courage and kindness to resilience and friendship; from standing up to bullies, to saying sorry or to keep trying after failure; stories provide safe ways to understand complex ideas.

5. Storytime helps create routines that matter. Bedtime helps children to unwind, feel safe and sleep better. During the day, these times can encourage engagement and relaxation in a quiet environment.

Storytime may seem like a small insignificant activity, but within these pages lies the building blocks for our future generation.

So bear this in mind, when you want to pick the shortest story at bedtime or miss some pages out, even telling a child you only have 5 minutes, remember how important this time is.



If you are looking for a pre-school place please give us a ring on 07908182544 or pop down and see us. We take children **from 2 years**. We are now open till 3pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; 12 noon on Tuesday's and Thursday's is toddler group.

Go in proud, go in loud, and go in just as you are — curious, bold, and full of magic. Each and everyone of you have a special place in our heart.

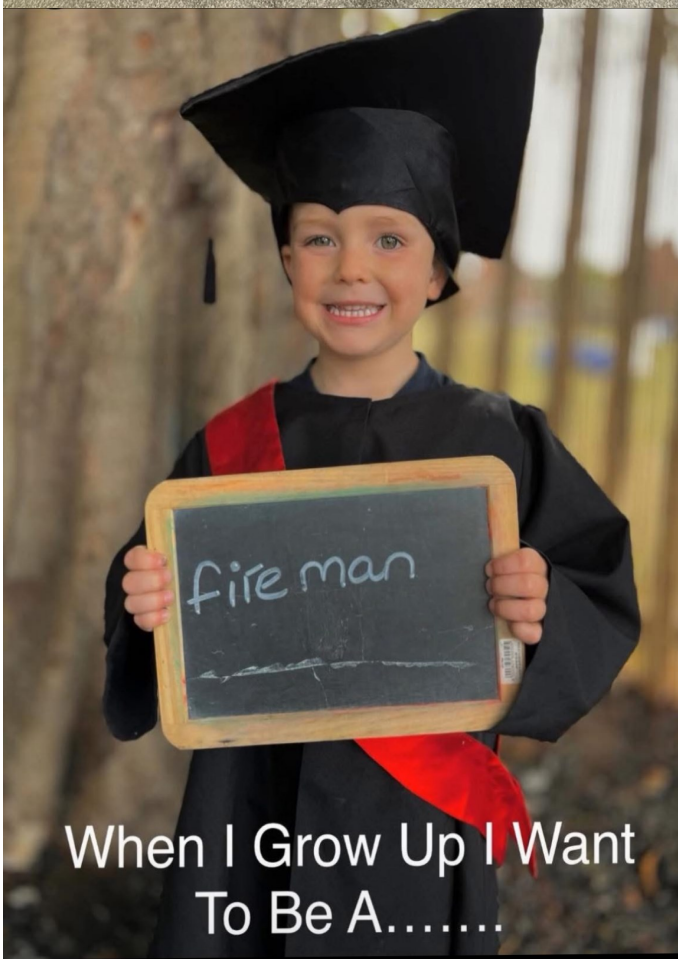
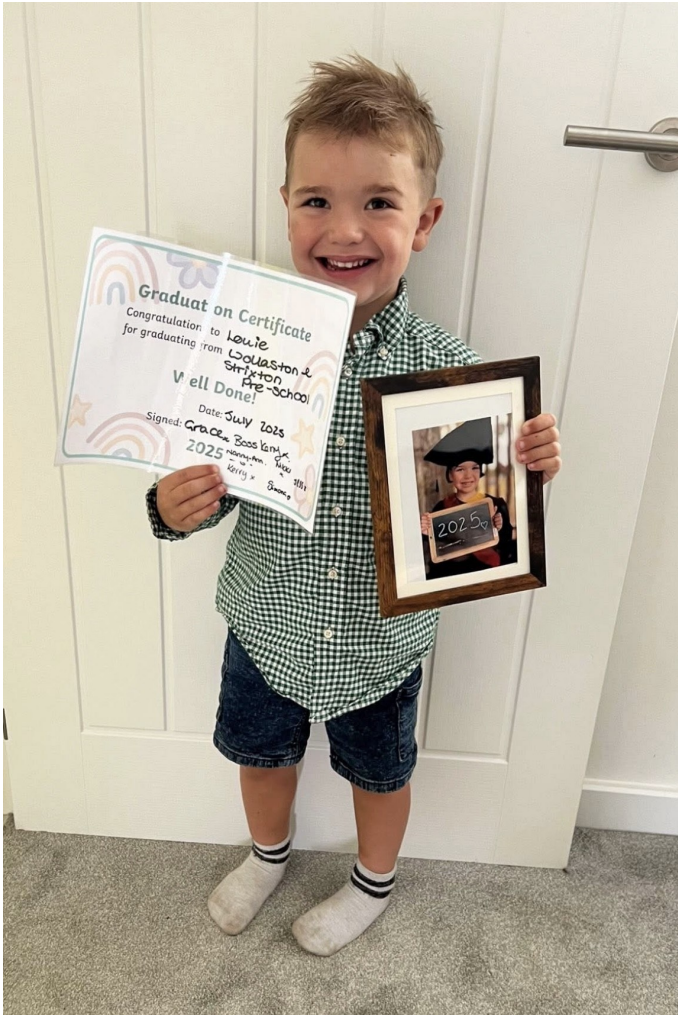
We wish them all the best and will miss them dearly.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who contributed, all our volunteers who collected food, Elaine McChesney who did an incredible job of managing the table and the volunteer rota and of course, Wollaston Co-op who have been huge supporters of WABIK and provided lots of food.

Whilst the table is no longer running, WABIK is still very much in operation.

As Autumn approaches, we will, as always, aim to ensure all children have a coat and Winter shoes.

We will soon be planning our Christmas efforts and once again aim to have a Christmas Meal for elderly members of both villages and to provide gifts for those children in either village who would not receive presents.

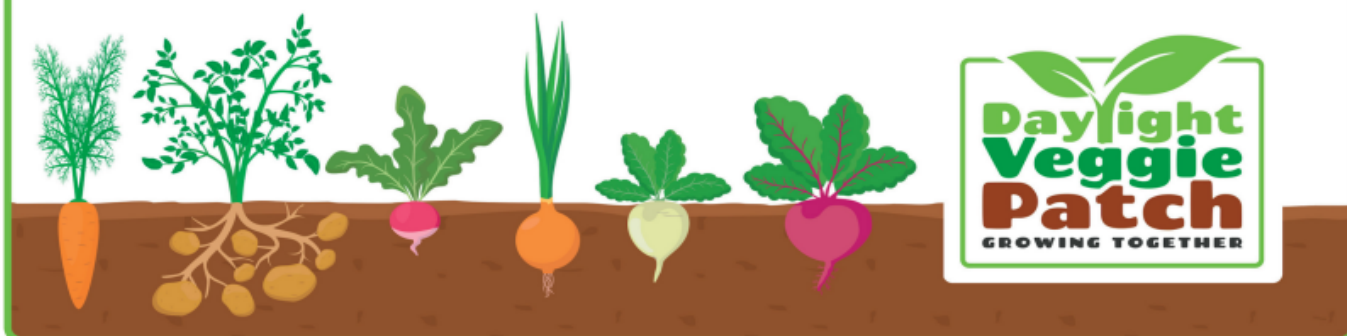
